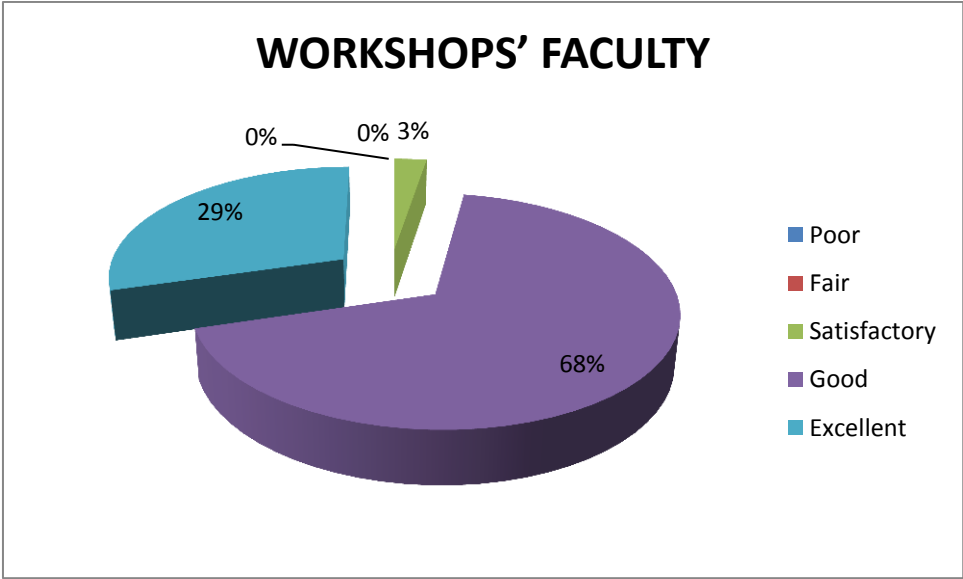
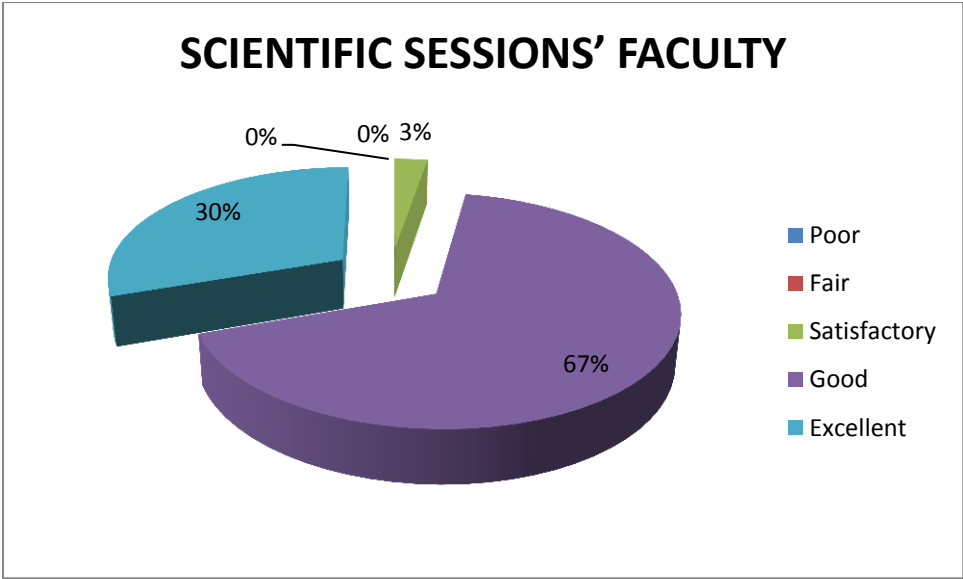


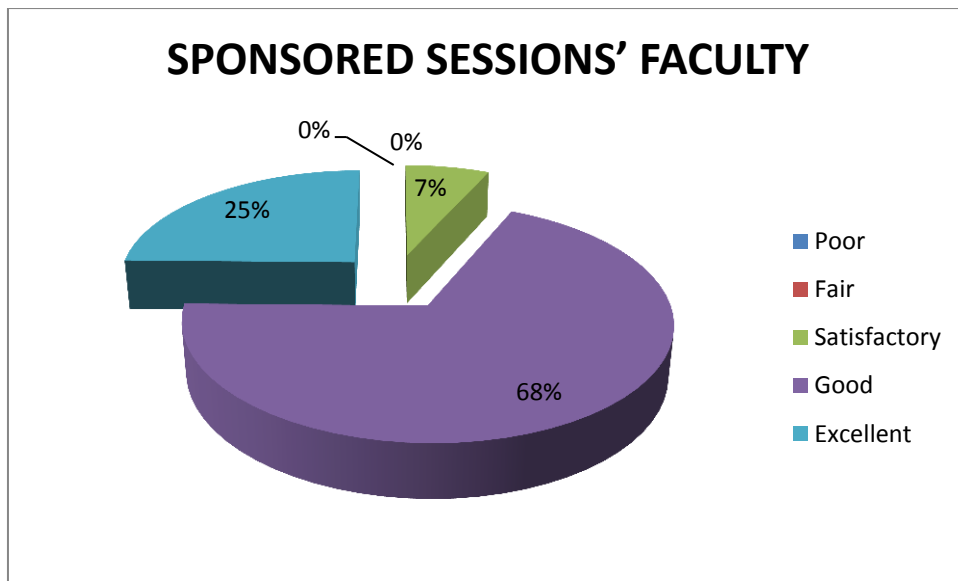












MAIN CONCLUSIONS
